This year, on International Women's Day, we have celebrated women that we admire. Our learning has focused on the achievements and strengths of women we know. As a class, we read about Vicki Jellie's story and her work to raise funds for the South West Regional Cancer Centre.

Literacy

This week we completed a Cold Write.

The topic was 'The Day I Turned into a ...'

The students have written some entertaining stories that the teachers have enjoyed reading. We have also been completing a narrative called 'Fire' based on the structure of our mentor text 'Flood'. We are almost at the stage where we will edit and publish our stories. Our explicit teaching this week has focused on punctuation and how to correctly structure speech in writing.

Grade P-2 Update

As part of their literacy learning, students have been posing wonderings about a text they are reading and exploring turning them into questions. In Writing, students concluded their learning narratives by completing a Cold Write titled 'The day I turned into a....'. Following the completion of our narrative learning students have begun exploring persuasive texts, exploring the ideas of 'point of view', 'convincing' and 'reasons' to support their point of view. In Sounds Write, Prep students have now shifted their focus to the sounds /b/, /c/, /h/ and /g/. Whilst Grade 1 and 2 students this week have completed their final review unit this week before they begin learning new content next week when we begin unit 14 of the extended code.


In Maths, Prep students have continued to develop their number sense and understandings within 20, with some students pushing these understandings within 50. The last fortnight we have been focusing on correct sequencing when counting the numbers 13-19 and also counting backwards to ensure our number sense within 20 is embedded. Grade 1/2 students have also been exploring comparing and ordering numbers in a range of contexts. A great game they have been using to practise this skill is double hattrick, where they need to correctly label a number line based on a number they roll, with the aim of getting 4 numbers in a row.

In Science, students have been exploring the different characteristics that different animals have and how these features help them in their environment.

All Grade Prep, One and Two students were thrilled to complete 'shopping' as part of our positive behaviour program this week. As part of this program they earn points, for positive behaviours in class, that they are then able to spend on item/s of their choice.
